

## ORGANIC STANDARDS

### SEED PREPARATION

- Uses untreated seeds
- Never uses GMO seeds

### SOIL & WATER

- Builds healthy soil through crop rotation, compost application, cover cropping and mulch
- Retains water more efficiently because of increased organic matter in the soil

### WEED CONTROL

- Physical removal of weeds rather than chemical destruction
- Controls weeds through cultivation and hand hoeing

### PEST CONTROL

- Maintains a balance between pests and their natural predators through healthy soil
- Uses beneficial insects, biological and cultural practices to control pests
- May use trap crops, planted to lure insects away from the cotton

### HARVESTING

- Relies on seasonal freezes or applied heat for natural defoliation
- May stimulate defoliation through water management

### ORGANIC COTTON CERTIFICATION

- Anvil uses organic cotton that is certified through independent third party certifying bodies to the USDA's NOP<sup>2</sup> standard

### GIN, SPINNING and KNITTING

- Machinery is cleaned out before use to avoid contamination

### DYEING and FINISHING

- Anvil uses dyes that are manufactured by companies that agree to conform to ETAD<sup>3</sup> by-laws and code of conduct standards and are free of environmentally unfriendly products

### CUTTING and SEWING

- Organic fabric is kept separate, clearly identified and tracked through the cutting and sewing process

## CORPORATE RESPONSIBILITY

### SOCIAL CERTIFICATIONS

- Anvil is a corporate signatory to SAI<sup>4</sup>, which promotes the SA 8000 standard. SA 8000 is firmly based on established international standards, including International Labour Organization (ILO) Conventions, the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, and the Universal Declaration on Human Rights.
- Anvil's cut and sew facility in Honduras has been WRAP<sup>5</sup> certified since 2005.

- Anvil supports the CERES Principles, a ten-point code of corporate environmental conduct.
